## Mike Tucker - co-host and expert in the areas of counseling and relationships

Mike served in the host seat of Lifestyle Magazine for 16 years. He has hosted this award winning

show since 2004. Mike and his wife Gayle co-hosted together from 2007 until 2016.

Additionally, Mike and Gayle established Mad About Marriage television programs and seminars. In just over 6 years they taped more than 50 television programs on marriage and family (seen by more than 4 million people each week), co-authored books like *Mad About Marriage* and *Marriage Mantras*, wrote more than 300 blogs on marriage, and conducted Mad About Marriage Seminars throughout North America, El Salvador, Russia, Sweden, Jamaica, Australia and New Zealand.

It was while conducting a Mad About Marriage Seminar in Vancouver, British Columbia, on March 4 and

5 of 2016, that Gayle experienced the first symptoms that resulted in the eventual diagnosis of Pancreatic Cancer and ultimately her death on April 10 of that year. Mike continues the couple's work as co-host of Lifestyle Magazine and remains an important part of Faith For Today.

Mike Tucker is the Speaker Emeritus for Faith For Today Television, the parent company of Lifestyle Magazine. He continues to conduct the Good Grief Seminars, Mad About Marriage Seminars and other transformational seminar events.



Mike holds a Master's Degree in Counseling and has served as a "Pastor's Pastor" for ministers. He has authored several books, including: A Time For You; Journal of a Lonely God; Jesus, He's All You'll Ever Need; Heart Food; Jesus, Your Heart's Desire; Every Good Thing; Ten Keys to a Happy Marriage, Laws of Dating, Tears To Joy: One Man's Journey Through Grief and more.
